

Introduction

The Greenville Independent School District is committed to building a strong relationship between our parents/guardians, community members and educators. This partnership supports family well-being, continuous development, learning and achievement of students, families and educators.

In accordance with the Commissioner's Rule 102.1003 (f), GISD will implement the following family engagement strategies that are based on our community/family needs. These practices are proven to demonstrate positive short-term and long-term outcomes for early childhood education. This document highlights six family engagement plan components.

A. Facilitate family-to-family support using strategies such as:

• Provide a safe and positive environment on the campus to promote family engagement and consider the different barriers that hinder family involvement.

• Implement activities that build positive and productive relationships where families can learn from each other.

• Provide a "Meet the Teacher" night before school begins to give parents an opportunity to get to know the classroom teacher and other families of students.
