

L.P. WATERS REPLACEMENT



- 500 student capacity
- Single-story building
- Built on current site
- Original to be demolished following move into new campus
- Opening August 2024

- Original campus is 72 years old
- Does not meet TEA requirements
- Repair exceeds replacement

NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL



- 1,400 student capacity
- Serves grades 6-8
- Two-story classroom wings
- Cafetorium
- Track & field
- Tennis courts
- Opening August 2025

Travis 6th will transition to Travis Elementary K-5 to provide elementary student capacity once new Middle School opens.

MORE THAN 20 COMMUNITY AND STAFF DESIGN MEETINGS SINCE MAY
















DESIGN PRIORITIES

SAFE AND SECURE

Physical and emotional safety are prerequisites of a successful design.

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PLAY AND EXPLORATION

Intentional places for multiple types of play enhances the learning environment.



NATURAL LIGHT

All instructional spaces should have daylight, preferably direct to the exterior, while minimizing glare and direct heat gain.



Outdoor learning and gathering spaces are valued but need to be clearly defined and secure.



APPROPRIATE SCALE

Consideration for the perspective of young children should lead to an appropriate scale that relates to home.




ACCESSIBILITY

Indoor and outdoor spaces should be designed for all physical abilities and developmental needs.
















DESIGN PRIORITIES

DAYLIGHT

All instructional spaces should have daylight, preferably direct to the exterior, while minimizing glare and direct heat gain. \mathcal{I}

SEPARATION OF GRADE LEVELS

Each grade level (6-8) to have "house" concept.

OPEN BUT SECURE

Allow students and teachers to connect beyond the classroom, within secure academic clusters.

OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE

Outdoor learning and gathering spaces are valued but need to be clearly defined and secure.




CLARITY OF CIRCULATION

Circulation paths should be clear, straight, wide, and easy to supervise.

New middle school building to be able adapt and grow with possible expansion of future district CTE programs.





- ONE VERTICAL CABINET IN EACH CLASSROOM




- UPPER AND LOWER SCIENCE CASEWORK STORAGE
- EMERGENCY EYE WASH STATION IN EACH LAB




 MOBILE STUDENT LAB TABLES

- SEATING LAYOUT CAN BE ACCOMMODATED FOR BOTH DINING AND PERFORMANCES




 VERTICAL FOLDING PARTITION AT STAGE OPENING FOR BLACK BOX AND CAFETERIA SEPARATION




- 84' LONG MAIN BASKETBALL COURT AND STANDARD VOLLEYBALL MAIN COURT

Building a Total Project Budget




Proposed New LP Waters Early Childhood Project Schedule
