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February Fact - MANDT Reminder:

Are you looking behind the behavior?

Many behaviors that individuals exhibit are secondary behaviors; something else is the underlying cause or trigger of what we see. Anger, for instance, is always a secondary emotion. There is something behind the anger that is driving the behavior. The most common causes of anger are fear, stress, hurt, embarrassment, disappointment, etc. These primary emotions often come out in the form of anger. Remember the shaken Coke can example from the Mandt training? Every day we encounter students, parents, and coworkers that have been "shaken" before they interact with us. When they become frustrated or angry, we often forget to pause and look behind the behavior to try and find the underlying issue. Next time you are in a difficult situation or conversation and anger is present, challenge yourself to take a step back and consider the "why" behind the anger. Determining the root cause of people's behavior will help all involved find a better solution and create positive next steps.


Karen McGee - KGJ STEM
