MARCH FACT - CHANGING THE RATIO

Research from the Mandt System indicates that 16 out of 20 interactions that students have in one day in a school atmosphere are negative. Our goal as educators is to change this ratio!

According to the ASCD:

School climate refers to the school's effects on students, including teaching practices; diversity; and the relationships among administrators, teachers, parents, and students.

School culture refers to the way teachers and other staff members work together and the set of beliefs, values, and assumptions they share. A positive school climate and school culture promote students' ability to learn.

We set the tone and mood every day. It is our choice how we impact our campus and district climate and culture. We are not thermostats; we are thermometers! We determine the climate around us, for ourselves, our students, and our coworkers.

WAY TO GO CROCKETT & KGJ!

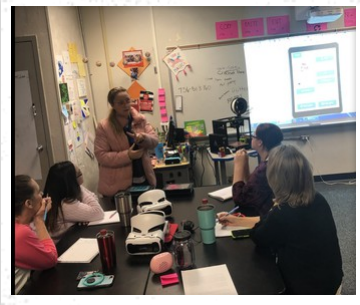
In preparation for National Tell a Fairy Tale Day, Crockett/KGJ STEM held teacher-led rotations to learn more about using fairy tales in their lessons.

Gina Burk and Amanda Marshall shared writing strategies from the Gretchen Bernabie training they attended.

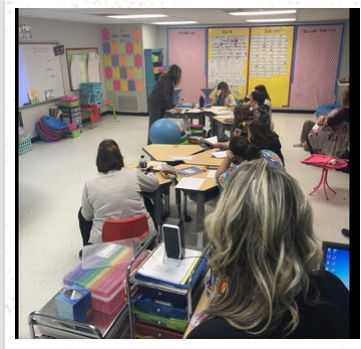
Crystal Teeters and Vanessa Haugen instructed teachers on STEM challenges connected to fairy tales
