

Check out these wonderful action shots from Josie Luna's PK3 class. This is what student engagement is all about.


In the first picture, the students are working together to get the spider and the pumpkins out of the basket. They are using different sized tongs. The student on the left was showing the student on the

LPW is all about teaching students the importance of helping and sharing! Great work Ms. Luna!






November Mandt Moment

As we enter into a month that celebrates gratefulness, it is good time to pause and realize that many of our GISD students and families do not have some of the basic things that we may take for granted each day.

The Mandt System points out that many individuals that we encounter and serve daily in education do not have their basic human needs accounted for consistently. If people do not have their basic needs met, their focus will be on getting those needs met. For example, "When there is a three-day weekend, students involved in the free breakfast or lunch program will gorge themselves because they are not sure when or how much they will have to eat during those days" (The Mandt System, 2017).

We are all familiar with the Maslow's pyramid. But, take a moment to look at it in a fresh way. Do you know students or families that are struggling in a specific area of the pyramid? Do you have students that struggle to feel they like they belong? Do you know of children that are uncertain if they can reach success or accomplishment? When you think about a lack of warmth, sleep, or safety, do you see specific faces?



Now, think about each individual you pictured. Are they also struggling in classes, in other areas of life, with learning, etc? If people have unmet needs that fall into areas at the bottom of the pyramid, they will be unable to move up to the next levels successfully. Education, though, focuses on the top of the pyramid becoming a reality. What does that mean for us?

We need to know our GISD students and families. When we see needs, we need to do our best to fill those needs. Find the moments where you can help fill vulnerability and esteem gaps. Love them, and remind them of their value. Remind students that in this district, in our classrooms, with GISD teachers and staff, they are important, and they are safe. Success for every child is more than academics. Success for every child is starting with their basic needs and finding ways to help them climb the pyramid to be all they are capable of being!

Make that connection! Change that life!
